



A pastoral Message from Senior Leaders of Rochester Diocese

Bishop Jonathan, Bishop Simon, Archdeacon Allie, Dean Philip Hesketh, and Matthew Girt wrote to the diocesan family on 31st January. Their pastoral message follows the allegations of sexual assault and misconduct that have been reported in the media regarding Bishop John Perumbalath, and the subsequent announcement of his retirement. Given Bishop John's previous connections with this Diocese, the message acknowledges the impact that may be being felt by some in the Diocese, and how people can reach out if they need to.
