Your PCC Matters: A Digest of January's PCC Meeting

The formal minutes will be made available on the PCC notice board at the back of church once they have been agreed.

- An Away Day is being planned to give the PCC the opportunity to discuss God's vision for St Paul's. We are delighted that Archdeacon Allie Kerr has offered to join us to lead the day. In preparation for this, a Saturday morning prayer meeting will be held which will be open to everyone to participate in.
- Bromley Council has now given planning permission for the external lighting project to go ahead. This will provide better lighting at night, at the main entrance path and at the entrance to the halls. It is expected that work will start in 8-12 weeks.
- Following visits to the church and discussions with various IT professionals, the PCC has agreed to appoint Idium Technology Ltd to carry out work to improve the Wi-Fi networks across the church, office and halls. This will improve the reliability and coverage for all users of the church buildings. The team, led by David Charlesworth, was congratulated for reaching this first stage of a wider IT/AV project.
- Final details have been agreed for new external noticeboards which will enable more information about church activities to be displayed in a more attractive way.

Wycliffe Bible Translators Mission of the Month (Jan & Feb)



We support Julian and Catherine, with Wycliffe Bible Translators, and we are looking forward to Julian's visit to St Paul's on Sunday 9th February (see notice on page 2 for more details).

"The villages of the Caucasus, where "Yakar" is spoken are particularly spiritually barren places. While it is possible to find at least some kind of church in the multi-ethnic gateway towns of the Caucasus, in the villages — in the cultural heartlands — there is effectively no Christian witness at all. This makes it more vital for the translated books of the Bible into Yakar to be distributed in social media and into audio CDs so that people can hear the Bible in their heart language which they may not be able to actually read. Whether it is a Scripture quote or a short video, social media provides a way of potentially engaging those who might never pick up a printed book. Please pray for the "Yakar" team to find creative ways to make God's Word available.
