Christmas Greetings from St Paul's

'Jesus gave life to everything that was created, and his life brought light to everyone.'

'The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness can never extinguish it.'

(John Chapter 1, verses 4-5)

Having been Vicar at St Paul's for a mere four months, someone asked me 'what have the highlights been so far?'

Initially I thought about events like the summer Community BBQ and the new 'Knit and Natter' group; or the special services.

But then it struck me: it's actually the people who are the highlights — those dedicated volunteers growing the life of the church, and the neighbours from the Parish whom I encounter and talk with daily, and who share important 'stories' which shape their lives.

The Bible is full of 'life stories' — complicated lives, full of ups and downs, tragedies and miracles. We can see where God is present in the messiness and darkest of places. God often turns what seems to be rubbish into gold. This is what the prophet Isaiah describes as 'beauty for ashes'.

St Paul's is truly a beautiful church, inside and out. The loving care spent tending the premises is reflected in the way the church family cares for one another. Our vision is to reach out especially to people who are feeling isolated, whether lonely from living alone or lonely within their relationships.

But why do we care? What is the driving force shaping lives, our services and busy community activities? The answer is the One who is life-transforming: Jesus Christ.

We find great comfort and joy in a God who chose to come right into the messiness of the world — a light that shines into the darkness and offers hope to all people.

Let there be Light!

Changes are taking place at St Paul's. The slow, steady growth of the yew trees has cast ever-darker shadows over the entrance path. Our single door light struggles to penetrate the gloom. So, the yew trees have received a much-needed prune, and new lighting is being installed to improve safety for people walking on the church paths.

Pruning the yew trees will allow more light to reach the path and enable everyone to see the church entrance and tower more clearly. Don't be alarmed that some branches are bare! Yew trees regenerate, and they will start to green up again over the coming months.

Following extensive consultation with a specialist lighting company, and mindful of light pollution and the church's Victorian heritage, we will be erecting a Victorian lamppost on the path to the church entrance, adding uplighters either side of the church door, and installing lanterns above the church door and at the entrance to the church hall.

Please do look at the display at the back of church, as we apply for planning permission.
