**Thank you from Welcare** - A big thank you to those who contributed to the Welcare Christmas appeal. £37 was raised and was gratefully received.

The Private Member's 'Climate and Nature Bill' is set for Second Reading in the House of Commons on 24<sup>th</sup> January. It is essential for a quorum of MPs to be physically in the chamber and support it, to ensure that the Bill goes forward for further debate. The current Environment Bill was world-leading at the time, but is no longer fit for purpose, given the rapidly-escalating scale of the climate and biodiversity crisis. In particular, the new Bill acknowledges that both these aspects are intertwined, and one cannot be solved without the other. Please consider contacting your MP with a short message asking him/her to support the Bill on Jan 24<sup>th</sup>.
